It is seeking to respond to change and to efficiently manage workload. The strategy has been prompted by several changes in the way we work. Historic Scotland are proposing changes to their way of working which would see more listed building applications determined solely by local authorities. This means that it is a good time to examine our current way of working to see how the Council can best meet the terms of the proposed new way of working. A restructuring of the Planning Policy and Environment Team together with more rigorous business planning has led to a need to review workloads and to look at future priorities.

		The desire to make the best of external funding opportunities available has also been a key driver in taking forward the strategy. The Council wishes to continue a proactive role in the historic environment as well as carrying out its statutory protective role. Changes in the environment are ongoing. It is the intention that this strategy will help to manage and prioritise the Council's work on the historic environment to achieve the best results.
