The PPS, when implemented will have both positive and negative effects on the environment. It is relevant to the implementation of some EU Directives including the Water Framework Directive and the proposed European Directive on the Assessment and Management of Floods. The implementation of the PPS will have resource use implications. The effects of the framework are cumulative. It is our view that the effects of the framework are likely to have significant effects on the environment. The Aberdeen City & Shire's Coastal Flooding Policy Framework therefore requires the preparation of a strategic environmental assessment.
