

## Report a breach of Planning Control

Planning enforcement deals with complaints of development without planning permission such as:

- work being carried out without the necessary planning permission
- an unauthorised change of use
- failure to comply with conditions attached to a permission
- developments not built according to approved plans.

This is known as a breach of Planning Control. When considering whether to enforce or not against a breach, the Planning Authority must ensure that any action is fair, reasonable and is in the wider public interest.

## Planning enforcement has no control over:

- Disputes over boundaries or the ownership or control of land
- Antisocial Behaviour
- Technical building issues relating to Building Standards or a Building Warrant
- Matters relating to the management of a building site
- Parking disputes
