Subject to the following conditions:

1. The permission hereby granted shall, unless extended by the Roads Authority, expire at the termination of a period.
2. Arrangements for the deposit of materials or otherwise shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Head of Service – Roads & Infrastructure.
3. This consent may be removed at any time at the request of the Head of Service – Roads & Infrastructure or a Constable in uniform.
4. The material or otherwise shall be placed in the position specified in the permission, with their longer sides parallel to and about 300mm from the kerb and so sited as not to impede the drainage of the road or obstruct access to any manhole or apparatus of the local authority or of any statutory undertaker, with special emphasis on any fire hydrants and marker plates.
5. The site shall be properly barricaded off using red and white pedestrian barriers or approved equivalent at either end and alongside footway.
6. The Roads Authority shall be indemnified against any liability, loss, claim or proceeding whatsoever arising in respect of the placing of materials or otherwise on the road.
7. On removal of the material or otherwise, the site shall be left in a clean and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Head of Service – Roads & Infrastructure.
