SUMMARY

Aberdeenshire Council Carbon Management Programme is an environmental management tool similar, in many respects, to an Environmental Management System. It is designed to increase corporate responsibility towards its carbon emissions. It is a strategy for tackling corporate resource use; energy consumption and carbon emissions. It will form the basis for improving the Council's environmental performance on a continuous basis. Although the programme is relevant for the integration of environmental considerations, it is not intended to set any framework for development consents for projects or for other plans. To a limited extent the programme will drive the standards the Council uses for the design/construction of corporate buildings. Nevertheless the purpose of the programme is to ensure that the construction of corporate buildings does not ignore the value and vulnerability of the areas or exceeded environmental quality standards or limit values.

Despite its possible relevance to some EU Directives/Schemes, such as Eco-Management and Audit Scheme (EMAS) and EU Directive on Energy Performance of Buildings Directive, it is an environmental management tool in its own right suitable for addressing environmental impacts from corporate operations. It is not a policy, plan, programme, or strategy in the sense of driving projects and other activities, either with regard to the location, nature, size and operating conditions or by allocating resources. Indeed Aberdeenshire Carbon Management Programme will do for Aberdeenshire's corporate operations and activities what SEA will do for policies, plans, programmes and strategies. For these reasons it our view that the programme is not likely to have any significant environmental effects within the context of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005. SEA is therefore not required.
