## 6 Access Consultations, Issues etc SRDP submission

A response to the SRDP consultation was submitted to the SG by ALOAF and a reply was received from Paul Wheelhouse. There was a general consensus that there is no obvious access funding although it was recognised that funding may be available through indirect routes.

AR was disappointed by the consultation response by ALOAF as he felt it was slightly negative in terms of path development – a number of quality paths have been delivered through this funding mechanism.

On a side note, it was felt that there will be issues with funding for path development and maintenance in the future. It was suggested that a 'list' of funding opportunities would be useful to distribute to landowners/community groups etc. One possibility discussed was to use community funding opportunities for farmers to develop local path networks.
