What are we doing to increase efficiency?

Working in collaboration to procure services

We are working in partnership with Aberdeen City Council and Highland Council to jointly buy services.



By working in partnership, we are saving

£1.46 million per year

Using fewer buildings

Through our workSPACE strategy:





Streamlined our offices in Peterhead to reduce costs, from 12 offices to 1, saving £150,000 p/a

Releasing 30 facilities saved running costs of £727,000

Driving digital innovation

As part of our digital strategy we are:

- improving digital connectivity, so more meetings can be done remotely reducing travel expenses and emissions
- rolling out public access WiFi in many of our buildings.

Removing desk phones, so phone calls and meetings can be made direct from computers will save

£500,000
