Proposed Action Programme Update 2016 (March)

Prepared to support the delivery of the Proposed Aberdeenshire Local Development Plan 2016. The Action Programme is a 'live' document which identifies the actions which will help implement the policies and proposals of the LDP and demonstrate

how the Council is working with its partners to implement these.

Labour Market Bulletin Q1 2016 (May)

Produced quarterly this publication provides an overview for trends in the local labour market. For Quarter one 2016 there was an increase in the jobseeker allowance (JSA) claimant count of 0.3% across Aberdeenshire from the previous quarter and an increase of 0.4% from the previous year.

Labour Market Bulletin Q2 2016 (August)

Produced quarterly this publication provides an overview for trends in the local labour market. Quarter two showed the JSA claimant count in Aberdeenshire remained static over the quarter but has increased by 0.4% from the previous year.

Housing Land Audit 2016 (August)

Annual analysis of housing land supply in Aberdeenshire and Aberdeen City. Provides details of all sites which are allocated in for housing in the Local Development Plan or have consent of housing, with details of actual and predicted housing completions for each.



SIMD 2016 Briefing Note (September)

Initial headline figures for Aberdeenshire deprived from the latest government publication of the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation 2016.

SIMD 2016 Interim Report (October)

More detailed analysis of the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation 2016 for Aberdeenshire looking a break down for each domain that contributes to the overall deprivation ranking (Income, Employment, Education, Health, Housing, Geographical Access to Services and Crime)

Labour Market Bulletin Q3 2016 (November)

Produced quarterly this publication provides an overview for trends in the local labour market. For quarter three the JSA claimant rate for Aberdeenshire decreased by 0.1% over the three month period but increased by 0.3% year on year.



In 2016 only six of Aberdeenshire's 340 data zones were considered in the most deprived 20% in Scotland In August 2016 the Scottish Government released the latest version of the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD16).

In 2016 the most popular new born girl's name in Aberdeenshire were Isla, Olivia and Sophie.


The most popular boys name was Oliver.



Interested in Commercial Property analytics?

The Planning, Information and Delivery Team now have access to the Costar database, which provides information on over 400,000 commercial property buildings across the UK. The system provides information from space becoming available to it being let or sold, tenants moving in, leases expiring, or the building being demolished.

CoStar gathers and updates its data on an ongoing basis with over 8,000 sources, and has developed a state of the art research centre dedicated to monitoring the



Team Update

In June 2016 the former Information and Research (I&R) Team merged with the Delivery Team, creating the new **Planning, Information and Delivery Team**.

All of the previous work and publications produced by the I&R team will continue as before and the Team is still available to offer assistance with any information and research related enquiries. However the skill set and work programme within the Team has now broadened to include **Planning Delivery.**

The main role of the Delivery team is to develop and maintain the Councils Action Programme. All Local Authorities are required to produce an Action Programme as an accompanying strategy to be read in conjunction with their Local Development Plan. The Action Programme

identifies who/what is required to deliver the land allocations within the plan including required infrastructure to specific timescales.



The Action Programme is a valuable tool for the development process across Aberdeenshire as it contains detailed and routinely updated information on each allocated site which can be accessed and used by Council services, the development industry and the general public. Such information can quickly

and conveniently confirm the most up to date position


