

Conditions

1. The Licence Holder shall ensure that all venison dealings of transactions are recovered using the prescribed format, (as detailed overleaf) and all details must be given for each carcass or part of carcass. Records of all venison either delivered to a dealer's premises or collected by a dealer in Scotland must be recorded in the prescribed manner.
2. The Licence holder shall ensure that all records, invoices, receipts, consignment notes or other documents are kept for a period of three years, commencing with the date of the last entry in any record book.
3. Any authorised person or any police officer may inspect any record or document relevant to venison dealing and may inspect any venison or premises or in vehicles under a venison dealer's control. Copies or any document may be taken by an authorised person. An authorised person shall show his written authority when so requested.
4. A venison dealer may, at any time, surrender his licence to the Council and it shall be cancelled when it has been surrendered. A venison dealer will deliver his licence to the Council within seven days of the coming into effect of a decision of Court disqualifying him from holding or obtaining a licence.
5. A venison dealer's licence shall be returned to the Council within seven days if the Licence Holder ceases to deal in venison.
