



- 1** Follow the stone steps down to the bridge over the Mealie Burn. If you see the water running orange, this is from iron salts seeping out of the ground.
- 2** Hackley Bay is one of Scotland's most beautiful beaches and is only accessible at low tide. This sandy bay is a quiet spot for wildlife watching, including dolphins.
- 3** Forvie village was buried during a series of storms between 1413 and 1654. The ruins of Forvie Kirk are the only visible remnant of the village.
- 4** Forvie Moor is a NNR (National Nature Reserve). For more information visit the Stevenson Forvie Centre.
- 5** People are known to have been living in this area since Neolithic times. However, the sand dunes are constantly moving and a large crescent-shaped ridge curves around the Bronze-age site where 31 huts have been discovered.
