



1 The Bulls of Buchan is a collapsed sea cave forming an almost circular chasm (the 'pot') some 30 metres (100 feet) deep with the sea rushing in through a natural archway at the base.

2 Slains Castle is one of the most famous castles in Scotland due to its association with Bram Stoker and the Dracula story. It is set on the dramatic cliffs a short walk to the north - east of Cruden Bay and seems to grow out of the cliff. The steamship Chicago ran aground at full speed directly below Slains castle shortly before midnight in poor visibility in October 1894. The 27 crew were rescued by breeches buoy watched by a large audience at the castle who had been attending a ball.

3 In 1866 the steamer Wiston Hall from Liverpool was driven ashore in a storm. Despite rocket lines reaching the ship only 4 of the crew of 57 reached the shore. The drowned were buried at St James church, Cruden Bay.
