

- 1** Gardenstown – Typical Banffshire fishing village with later houses in tiers up the steep cliff from the harbour (1720). Most of the original pantiled fishermen cottages now have slate roofs with dormer windows.
- 2** Crovie – This outstanding conservation area has retained its unique character despite being virtually abandoned in the 1950's. Pedestrian access to the 70 houses is along the top of the rubble built sea wall. Car parking and an excellent viewpoint at the top of the hill.
- 3** Troop Head – Now under the guardianship of the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, the towering cliffs are the home of the largest mainland gannet colony in the UK.
