# 4 Scene setting and progress to date

Christine presented the role of the regeneration partnership, key activity to date and there was a discussion about communications in the early stages with many in the community expecting quick, visible results whilst the reality is that regeneration is long term and early work is invisible to most. The role of the Partnership is for public, private and third sector collaboration in setting the vision and delivery of regeneration in Banff. The partnership's role is to be ambassadors for the future of Banff and in developing public buy in to the plan.

#### **Terms of reference**

The membership of the partnership is out of date on the Terms of Reference document and should be changed prior to approval. **Action** LH – Invite David Locke and Jill Wilson to the Heritage Trail Discussions.

### 5 The bigger picture – facilitated session

Mary Arnold gave a presentation to the group: Giving an overview of the work being undertaken in the Banff Network. This was done using a visual representation, showing how partnerships were working together to deliver work that addresses some of the main issues affecting individuals. An example used was the delivery of the parenting programme Triple P which is being delivered in Macduff Primary and also an English for Speakers of other Languages course that is also being delivered in Macduff Primary.

Groups like Early Years forum, Community council also share the same vision as the development partnership.

What we are finding is that all groups are coming back to us with the same message. You will find that various groups are working towards the plan in various ways.

An example of proposed activity is that Banff Tesco are keen to get accreditation for Banff to become a Dementia Friendly Town. This would be a good positive for the community, led by businesses.

There was some discussion regarding health care services for the elderly. It was explained that Dementia Friendly Towns did not replace health care services but was a community initiative to improve understanding of those suffering from the disease.

The TURF group (Twin towns united regeneration Forum) are planning a community engagement event in September to invite ideas for the development of the town.

Tourist information centre is willing to be a hub for the community.

Action Point – Visit Aberdeenshire - Business to get information to Banff Tourist Office – Raise action with Visit Aberdeenshire - Banff Tourist Coast with regards to material at the centre.

Visit Aberdeenshire – take off table to discuss further
