Access Panels are made up of all ages and abilities who share a passion for the issues faced by disabled people. Panels are supported by Disability Equality Scotland as the national umbrella body.  The removal of this post would end the support provided by the Council to the three Access Panels in Aberdeenshire and impact negatively on disabled people across Aberdeenshire.
