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1. Overview

This document has been generated from information entered into the Integrated Impact Assessment system.

It has been common practise for a number of years to provide some free adult meals in schools, this has usually been for people who help in the dining room at lunch time but also used at the Head Teachers discretion which can lead to free lunches for the Head Teachers and their deputies which really is not equitable across the estate. In some site the Janitorial staff have their cards activated and Free Meals ticked by the school, so this again is not equitable across the estate. So the proposal is to remove this free meal entitlement which others who work over lunch periods do not get. This could save 30k per annum
