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1. Overview

This document has been generated from information entered into the Integrated Impact Assessment system.

To achieve target surplus requirement we will need to reduce our overall expenditure.

Some of this cost reduction will come from less production but that in turn means less income generation.

To meet the target surplus we will need to increase rates both internally and externally. However, internal clients are expected to purchase less materials from the quarries. Around 2/3 of quarry income is from internal clients.

This loss of income will make it impossible to generate the surplus. Raising external client prices is possible but in turn this may price ourselves out of the market.

An urgent review of the business model is required to further model scenarios.
