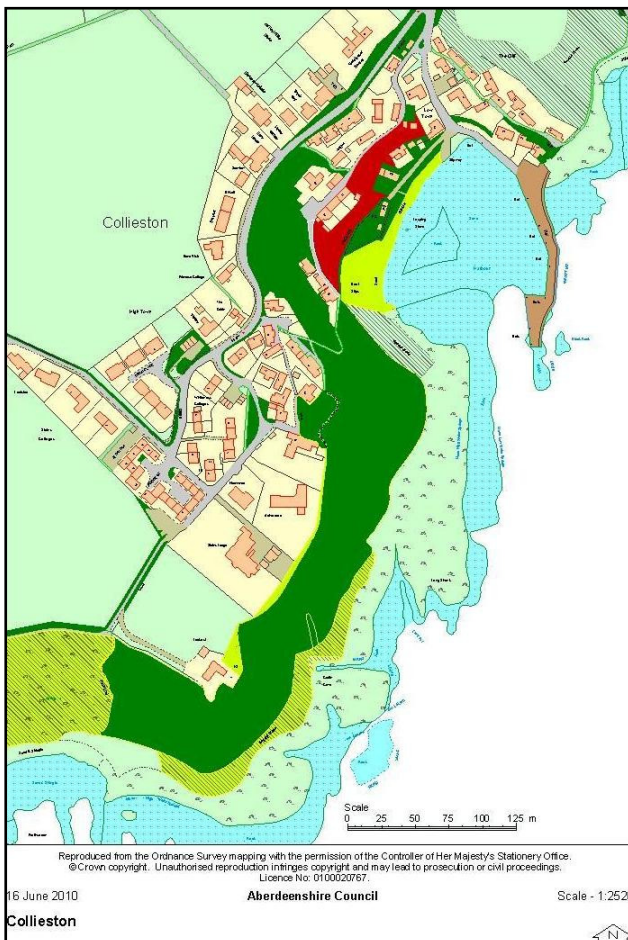
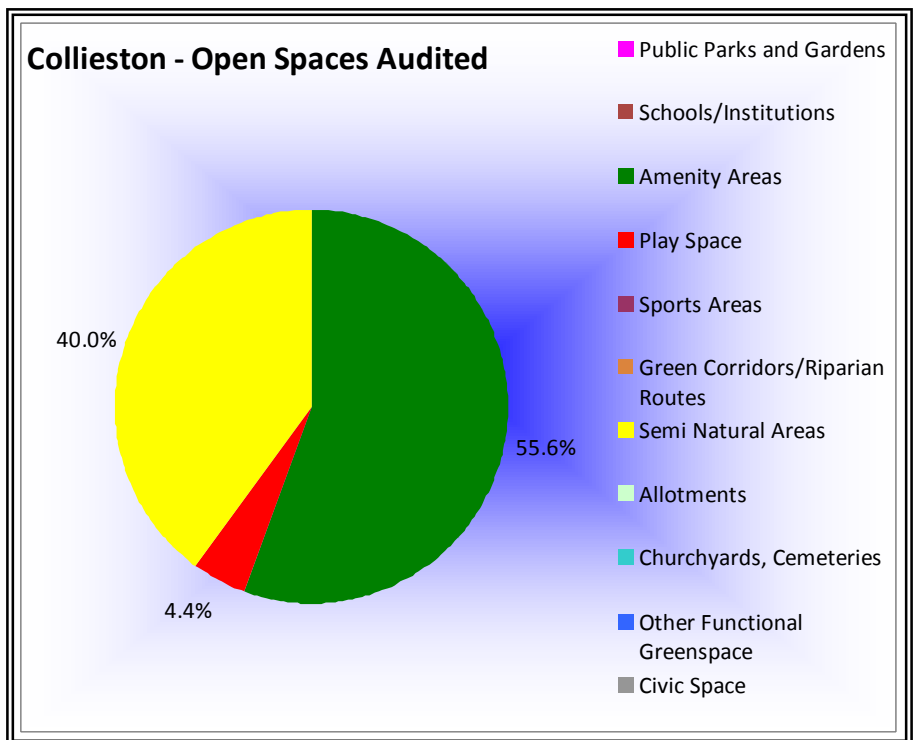

Green Network Links

The path between the car park to the north of the village and the popular viewpoint above it could be improved, both to provide access for disabled users and to enhance overall safety. A second path, linking the car park to the coastal trail, is due for improvements in late 2010.



Open Space Requirements

Given its coastal location and popular play park, few requirements for improvement were identified at Collieston. Auditors did suggest however, that the path surfacing at the play park would benefit from some improvement. As most of the land in and around the village is privately owned, any such improvement (including Cransdale Path) would be a matter for consideration by the local community /Collieston Trust.

Although there is very large strip of 'amenity' greenspace running through the village, for the most part this is fairly inaccessible, being on a steep slope. The area does however, have high amenity value in terms of biodiversity and as a landscape feature.
