



- 1** Cullen - this ancient royal burgh in Moray is home of 'Cullen Skink' a smoked fish soup.
- 2** The path at Logie Head climbs a series of stone steps built by a local man - be sure to read the dedication on the cairn to this mammoth task. The path at the top is very narrow and requires great care.
- 3** Sunnyside beach is recognised as one of the finest beaches in Scotland. Enjoy the views from the path especially to the west.
- 4** Findlater Doocote (16th century) is a distinctive whitewashed beehive shaped building just inland. Worth the short stroll to see where the pigeons which supplied nearby Findlater Castle with succulent 'squabs' were kept.
- 5** Findlater Castle was abandoned in 1600 by the Ogilvies of Findlater. The precarious ruins on a rocky promontory are best viewed from a distance. Viewpoint with information.
- 6** Sandend dates from around 1624. The tiny harbour is surrounded by traditional fisher cottages with a mixture of slated and pantiled roofs.
